Flight Crew Licensing FCL - Structure



Basic Regulation EC 216/2008

Article 7

Pilots

Pilots involved in the operation of aircraft referred to in Article 4(1)(b) and (c), as well as flight simulation training devices, persons and organisations involved in the training, testing, checking or medical assessment of these pilots, shall comply with the relevant 'essential requirements' laid down in Annex III.

FCL.010 Definitions

- balloon & class / group of balloon
- flight time
- student Pilot (minimum age solo)
- Theoretical knowledge examinations

Part-FCL Subpart A - General Requirements

FCL.060 Recent experience

(a) Balloons. A pilot shall not operate a balloon in commercial air transport or carrying passengers unless he/she has completed in the preceding 90 days at least one takeoff, approach and landing as a pilot flying in a balloon.



General requirements



Part-FCL Subpart A - General Requirements

FCL.065 Curtailment of privileges of licence holders aged 60 years or more

- (a) Age 60-64. The holder of a pilot licence who has attained the age of 60 years shall not act as a pilot of an aircraft engaged in commercial air transport operations except:
- (1) as a member of a multipilot crew; and,
- (2) provided that such holder is the only pilot in the flight crew who has attained age 60.
- (b) Age 65. The holder of a pilot licence who has attained the age of 65 years shall not act as a pilot of an aircraft engaged in commercial air transport operations.



General requirements



ICAO Annex I – Limitation of privileges

2.1.10.1 A Contracting State, having issued pilot licences, shall not permit the holders thereof to act as pilot-in-command of an aircraft engaged in international commercial air transport operations if the licence holders have attained their 60th birthday or, in the case of operations with more than one pilot where the other pilot is younger than 60 years of age, their 65th birthday.

Terms of Reference Subgroup LPL



measures shall also include "Such provisions for the issuance of all types of pilot licences and ratings required under the Chicago Convention, and of a leisure pilot licence covering non-commercial activities involving aircraft maximum certificated take off mass of 2000 kg or less and which do not meet any of the criteria referred to in Article 3(j)." (Basic Regulation 216/2008)



Part FCL **Subpart B** – Leisure Pilot Licence **Section 1** – Common Requirements

- FCL.100 Minimum Age of 16 years (licence)
- → FCL.105 Privileges and conditions
- → FCL.110 Crediting for the same A/C category
- FCL.120 TK (4 common subjects)



LPL requirements Part-FCL



Subpart B – Leisure Pilot Licence Section 6 – Specific Requirements LPL(B)

- FCL.105.B LPL(B) Privileges
- hot-air balloons / airships up to 4000m³
 - gas balloons up to 1200m³
 - carrying 3 passengers
 - FCL.110.B Experience
- → 16 hours dual flight instruction & 1 solo flight
 - including at least 10 fillings & 20 take-offs



LPL requirements Part-FCL



Subpart B – Leisure Pilot Licence Section 6 – Specific Requirements LPL(B)

→ FCL.135.B LPL(B) Extension to another class (hot-air & gas balloons / hot-air airships)

- → 5 instruction flights
- in the case of HAB -> HAA: 5 hours
- skill test including TK (4 subjects)



LPL requirements Part-FCL



Section 6 – Specific Requirements LPL(B)

- FCL.140.B LPL(B) Recency requirements
- Privileges shall be exercised only (24 months):
 - 12 h as PIC & 8 Take-offs / Ldg. or
 - 6 h as PIC & 1 Flight with LAFI/FI
 - or "Proficiency Check"

(if "extension" for another class: at least 2 additional hours in this class)

"...at least once every 6 years a proficiency check with examiner !.."



LPL requirements Part-FCL Specific Requirements



Proficiency Check - Recency requirements (BR - ER Annex III - 1.e.2)

"... An appropriate level of competence in practical skill must be maintained. Compliance must be demonstrated by regular assessments, examinations, tests or checks. The frequency of examinations, tests or checks must be proportionate to the level of risk associated with the activity..."





Proficiency Check - Recency requirements (BR - ER Annex III - 1.j.1)

Examiners

Persons responsible for assessing the skill of pilots must:

- (i) meet the requirements for flight or flight simulation instructors;
- (ii) be capable of assessing pilot performance and conducting flight tests and checks.

Subpart C PPL / SPL / BPL



Section 7 – Specific Requirements for the BPL FCL.205.B BPL - Privileges and conditions

- PIC Balloons and HAA
- Groups: small medium large (AMC p.359)
- Restricted: "non-commercial"
- commercial privilege: 75h proficiency check with examiner (see: page 356 NPA 2008-17)
- may receive remuneration for flight instruction



Subpart C PPL / SPL / BPL



Commercial licence for balloon operations?

ICAO Provisions – Annex I

2.10.1.3.4 **Recommendation.**— If passengers are to be carried for remuneration or hire, the licence holder should have completed not less than 35 hours of flight time including 20 hours as a pilot of a free balloon.

Section 7 – Specific Requirements for the BPL FCL.210.B BPL – Experience and crediting

- same requirements as for the LPL(B) but on balloons of the same group (size related)
- groups (AMC page 359): small/medium/large
- full credit for the LPL(B) holder
- → Medical class II



Subpart C PPL / SPL / BPL



Section 7 – Specific Requirements for the BPL FCL.225.B BPL – Extension class / group

- → another class: see FCL.135.B
- another group within the same class:
- at least 20 hours of flight time
- □ 3 instruction flights (on balloon of relevant group)
 Input: Group distinction (s.359) & AMC (s.262)

FCL.230.B BPL - recency see FCL.140.B



Subpart C PDI



Licence & experience for commercial operations?

- 16 hours dual training with FI
- 1 solo flight under supervision
 - Skill test with examiner
- 18 years / 75 hours as PIC of balloons
- Skill test for commercial privilege with examiner
- For group medium or large: at least 3 flights with FI
 - OPC check every 6 months (& recent experience)

FCL.915.LAFI Pre-requisites for the course

- passing of a pre-entry flight test (with FI)
- LAFI(B): 75 hours on balloons / at least 15 hours in the class and group for which instruction will be given

FCL.920.LAFI Training Course

- → TK instruction and instructional techniques
 → dual flight instruction:
 □ LAFI(B) 3 hours and 3 take-offs
 - & FCL.935.LAFI Skill Test

Subpart J – Instructors

Section 2 – Specific requirements for LAFI

FCL.940.LAFI Revalidation and Renewal

- the instructor has to fullfill 2 of 3 requirements:
- □ flight instruction (6h 2h preceding 12 months)
 - refresher seminar
 - proficiency check
- new: every third revalidation: proficiency check
- → Renewal: refresher seminar & proficiency check
